

Colorado exhibits, in profusion, specimens of her rich gold and silver ores. But her great attraction is her lifelike display of stuffed wild native animals. Here are some two hundred specimens, all prepared and most of them killed by Mrs. Martha A. Maxwell, of Boulder, Colorado, who has a great many not here exhibited, and three hundred stuffed birds in cases not yet opened. Among the animals are the mountain and the valley buffalo, mountain lion in pursuit of a deer, mountain sheep, male and female and young, six varieties of deer, grizzly, black and cinnamon bears with cub, wolverine, large grey wolf, coyote, six kinds of foxes, hedgehog, four species wildcats, mountain and common skunks, a variety of rabbits, conies, muskrats, minks, beaver, otter, mountain rats and squirrels in abundance. A cottonwood tree two feet and ten inches in diameter is shown eaten through by beavers.
